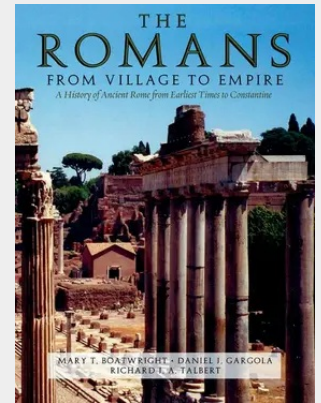


The Romans
