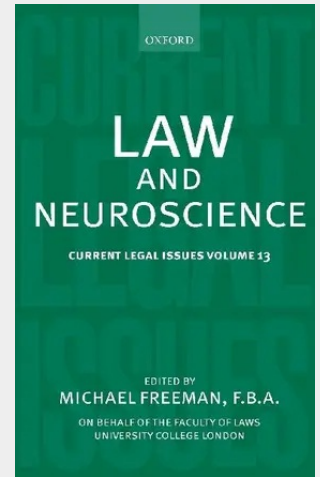


LAW & NEUROSCIENCE VOL 13 CLI C
