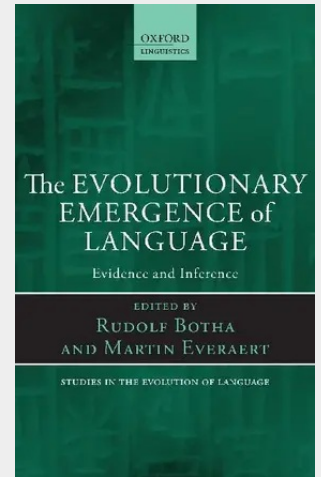


Evolutionary Emergence of Language
