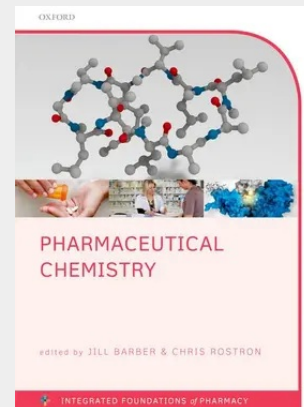


Pharmaceutical Chemistry
