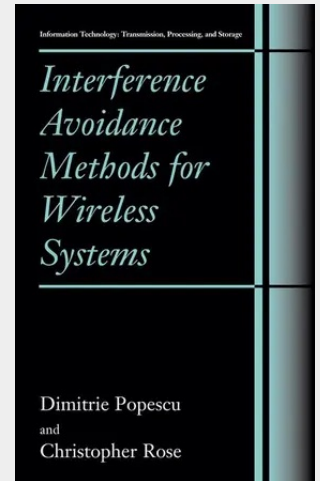


Interference Avoidance Methods for Wireless Systems
