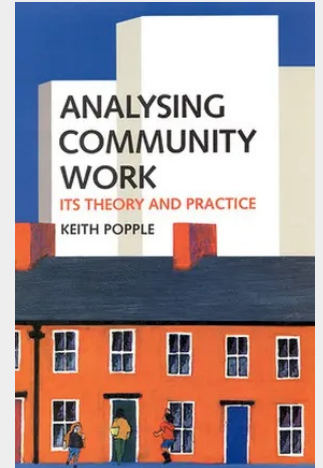


Analysing Community Work
