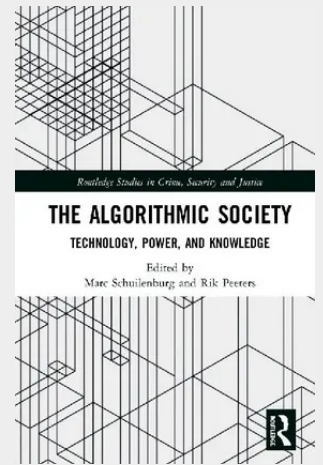


The Algorithmic Society
