

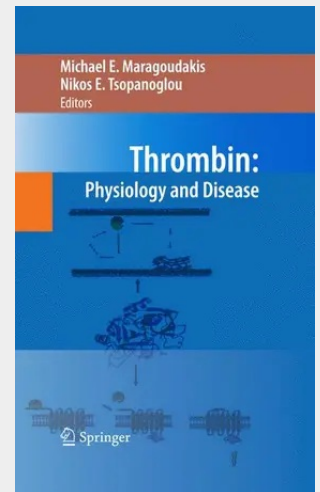
Thrombin
