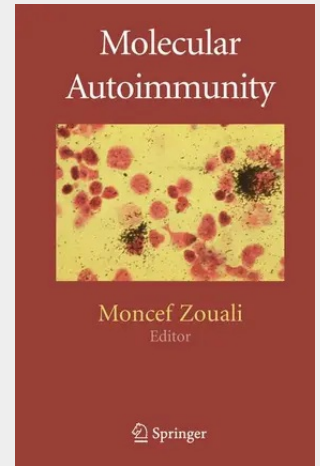


Molecular Autoimmunity
