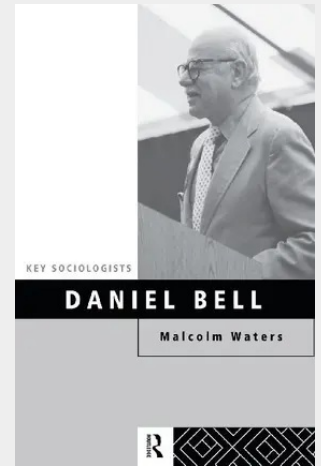


Daniel Bell
