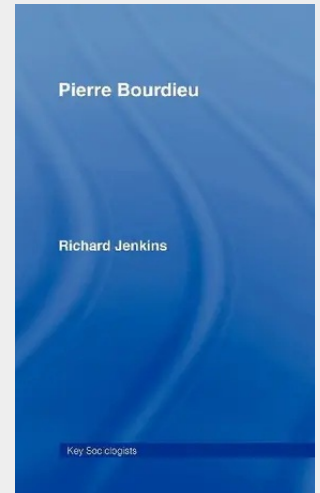


Pierre Bourdieu
