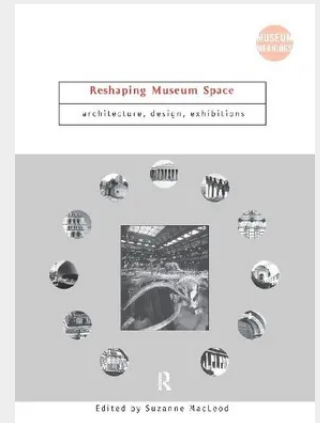


Reshaping Museum Space
