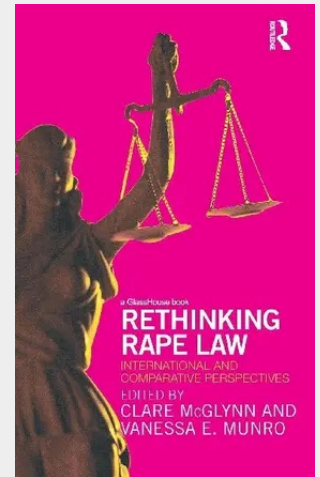


Rethinking Rape Law
