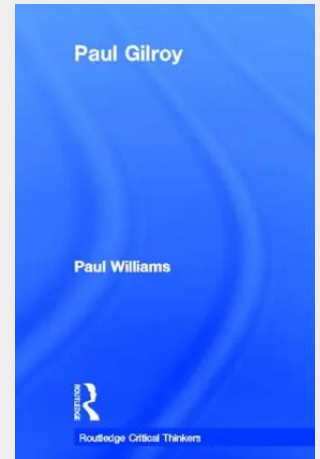


Paul Gilroy
