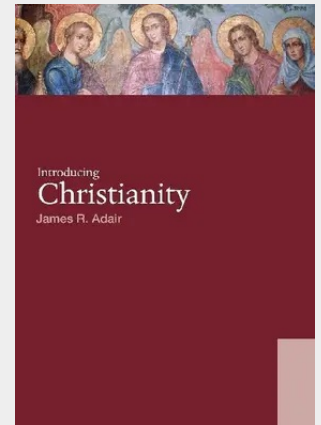


Introducing Christianity
