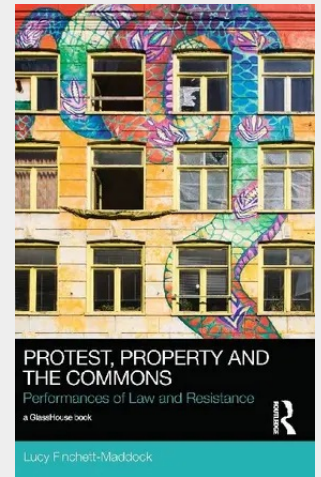


Protest, Property and the Commons
