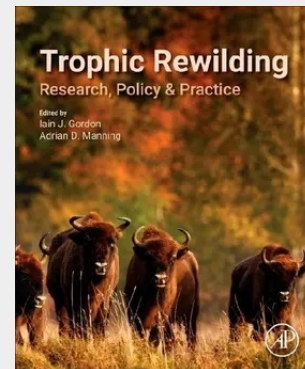


Trophic Rewilding
