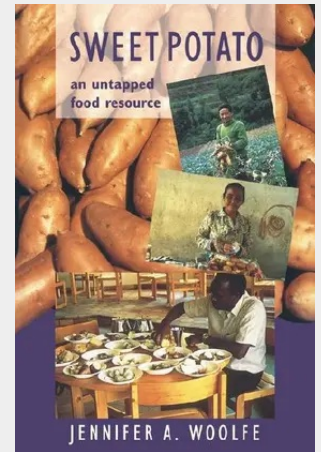


Sweet Potato
