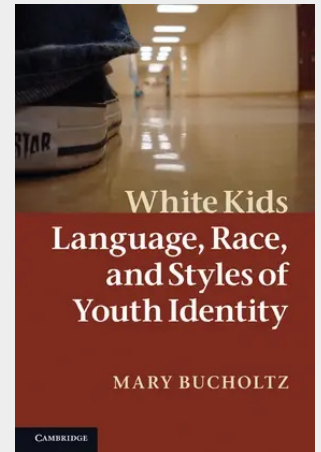


White Kids
