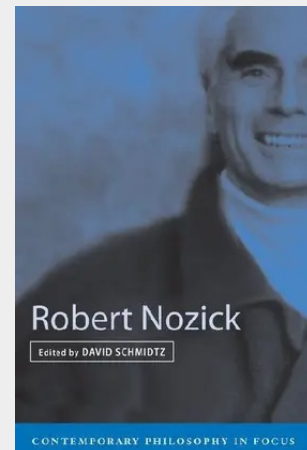


Robert Nozick
