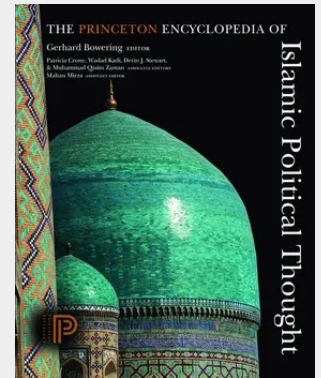


The Princeton Encyclopedia of Islamic Political Thought
