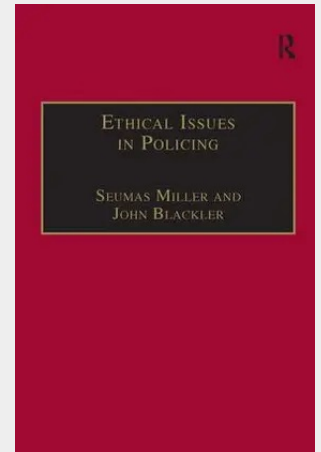


Ethical Issues in Policing
