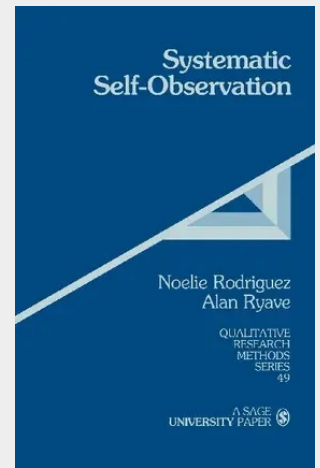


Systematic Self-Observation
