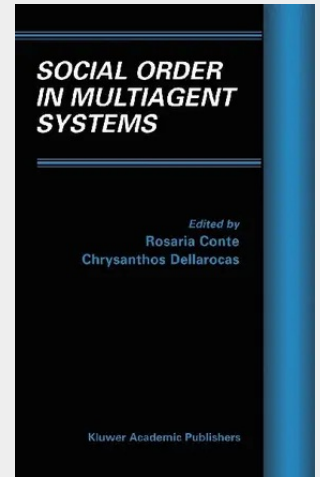


Social Order in Multiagent Systems
