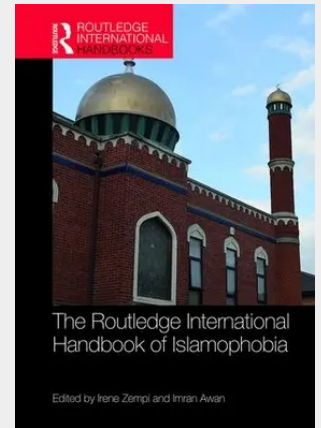


The Routledge International Handbook of Islamophobia
