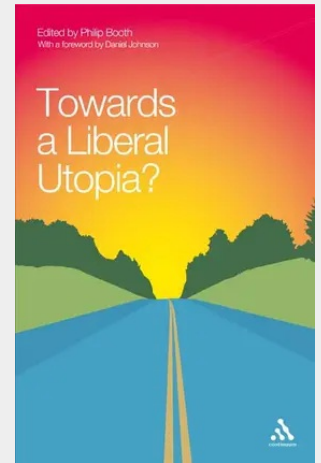


Towards a Liberal Utopia?
