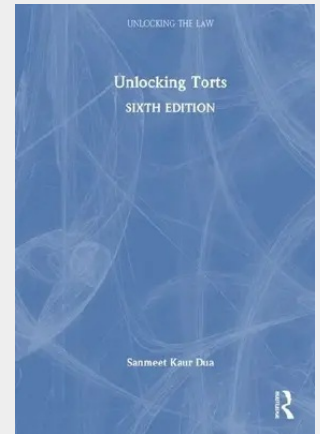


Unlocking Torts
