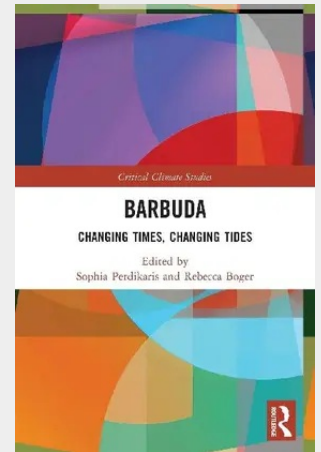


Barbuda
