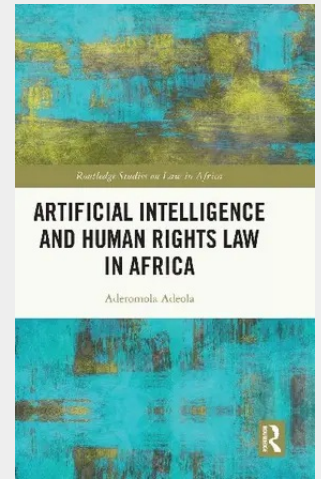


Artificial Intelligence and Human Rights Law in Africa
