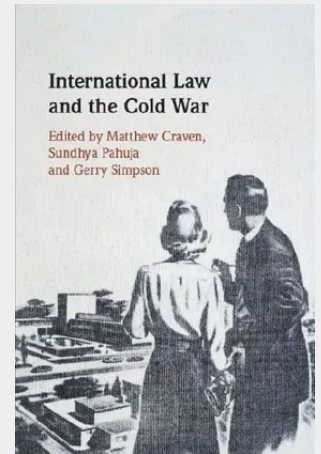


## International Law and the Cold War
