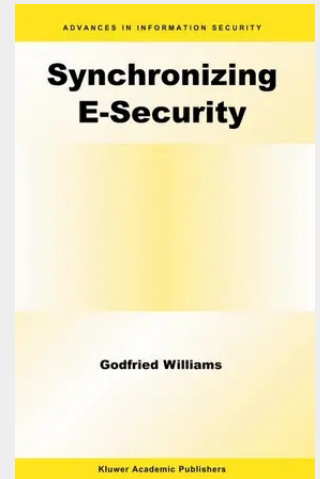


Synchronizing E-Security
