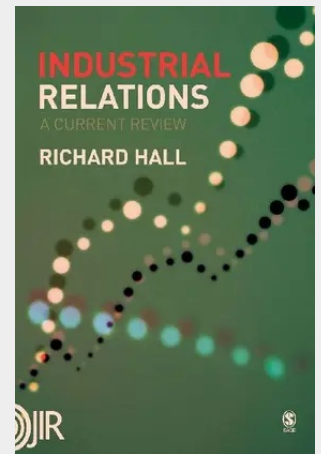


Industrial Relations
