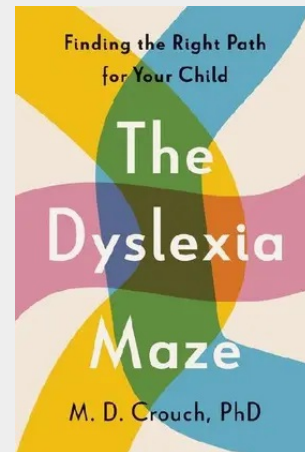


The Dyslexia Maze
