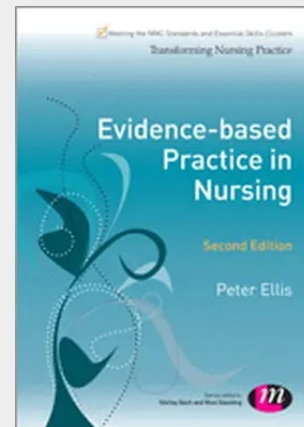


Evidence-based Practice in Nursing
