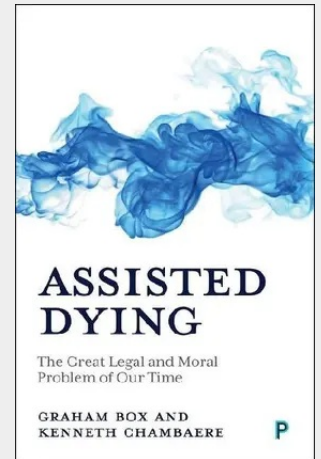


Assisted Dying
