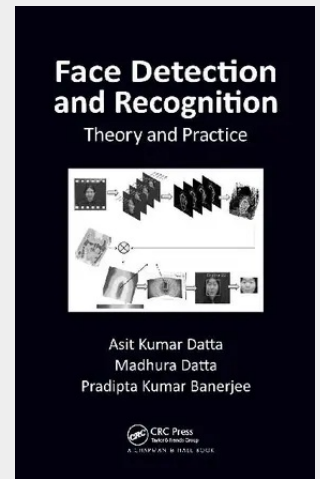


Face Detection and Recognition

Examples of their use include border control, driver's license issuance, law enforcement investigations, and physical access control.
