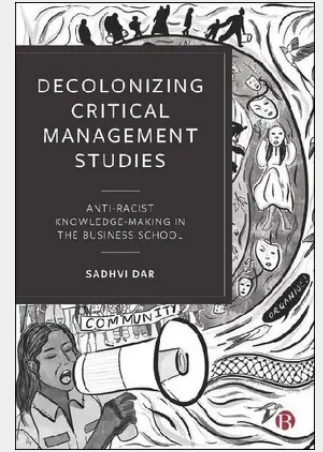


Decolonizing Critical Management Studies
