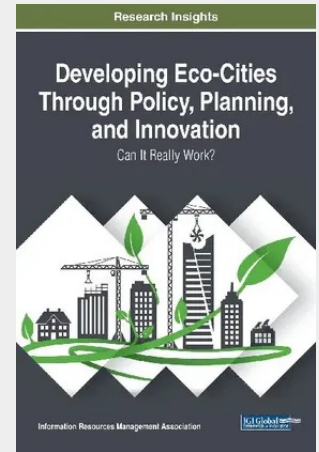


Developing Eco-Cities Through Policy, Planning, and Innovation
