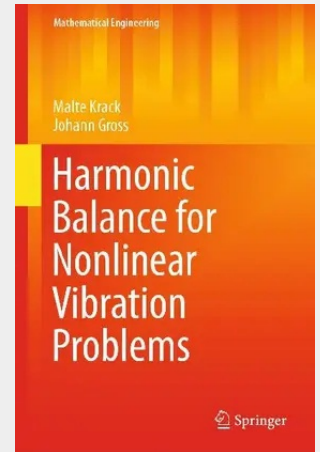


Harmonic Balance for Nonlinear Vibration Problems
