

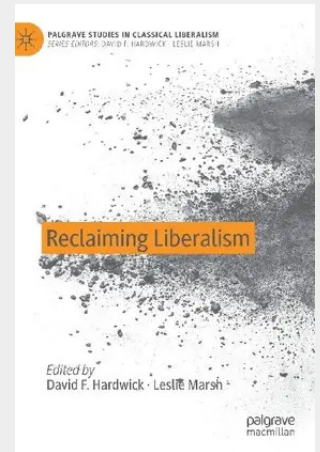
Reclaiming Liberalism
