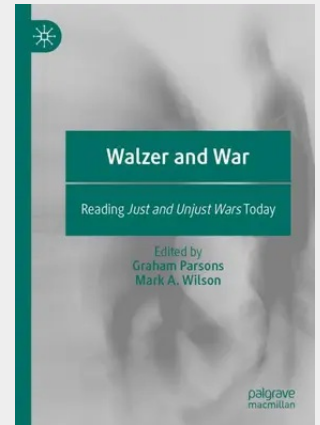


Walzer and War
