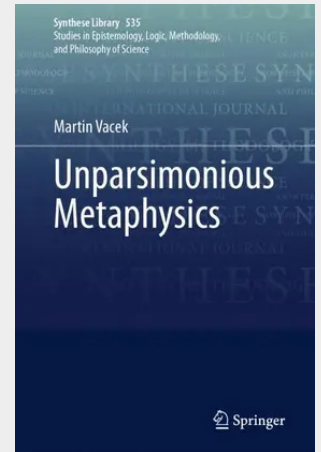


Unparsimonious Metaphysics
