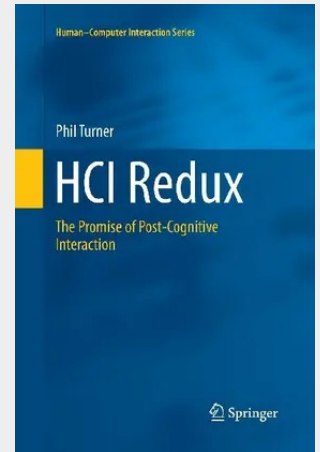
The Promise of Post-Cognitive Interaction
