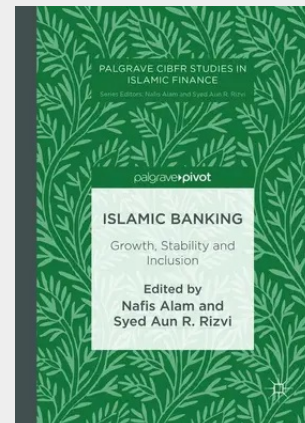


Islamic Banking
