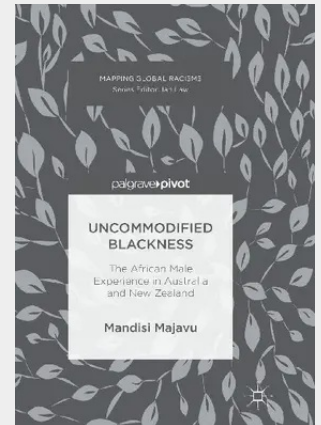


Uncommodified Blackness
