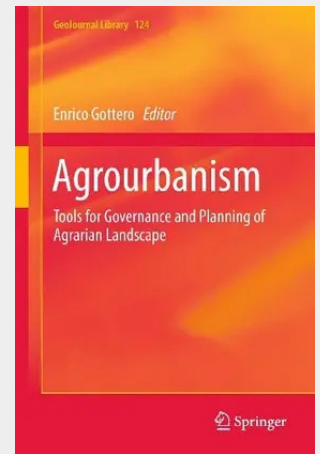


Agrourbanism
