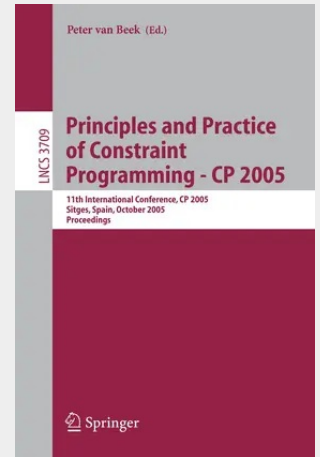


Principles and Practice of Constraint Programming - CP 2005

11th International Conference, CP 2005, Sitges Spain, October 1-5, 2005

The 11th International Conference on the Principles and Practice of Constraint Programming (CP 2005) was held in Sitges (Barcelona), Spain, October 1-5, 2005. The CP conference series is the premier international conference on constraint programming and is held annually. The conference is concerned with all aspects of computing with constraints, including: algorithms, applications, environments, languages, models and systems. This year, we received 164 submissions. All of the submitted papers received at least three reviews, and the papers and their reviews were then extensively discussed during an online Program Committee meeting. As a result, the Program Committee chose 48 (29.3%) papers to be published in full in the proceedings and a further 22 (13.4%) papers to be published as short papers. The full papers were presented at the conference in two parallel tracks and the short papers were presented as posters during a lively evening session. Two papers were selected by a subcommittee of the Program Committee—consisting of Chris Beck, Gilles Pesant, and myself—to receive best paper awards. The conference program also included excellent invited talks by Hector Georger, Ian Horrocks, Francesca Rossi, and Peter J. Stuckey. As a permanent record, the proceedings contain four-page extended abstracts of the invited talks.
