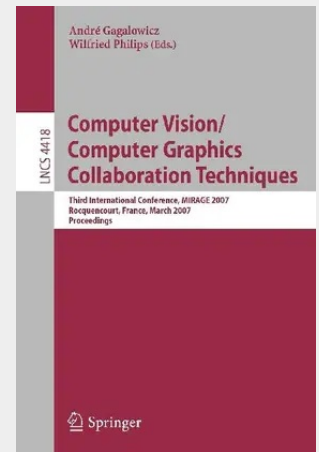


Computer Vision/Computer Graphics Collaboration Techniques

Third International Conference on Computer Vision/Computer Graphics, MIRAGE 2007, Rocquencourt, France, March 28-30, 2007, Proceedings

This volume contains the papers accepted for presentation at MIRAGE 2007. The Mirage conference is becoming recognized internationally, with presentations coming from 31 countries. South Korea proved to be the most active scientifically with a total of 73 submitted papers, far above China (27 submitted papers), Taiwan (10) and India (9), which proves the strong domination of Asia in the development of this new technology. We received a total of 198 submissions. Reviewing was very selective as the Program Committee accepted only 42 oral presentations and 17 posters. We had to extend the conference period from two to three days, as the number of submissions was multiplied by three compared to the previous conference, which proves that this conference attracts more and more researchers. All papers were reviewed by two to four members of the Program Committee. The final selection was carried out by the Conference Chairs. We wish to thank the Program Committee and additional referees for their timely and high-quality reviews. We also thank the invited speakers Peter Eisert and Adrian Hilton for kindly accepting to present very interesting talks. Mirage 2007 was organized by Inria Rocquencourt and took place at Inria, Rocquencourt, close to Versailles Castle.
