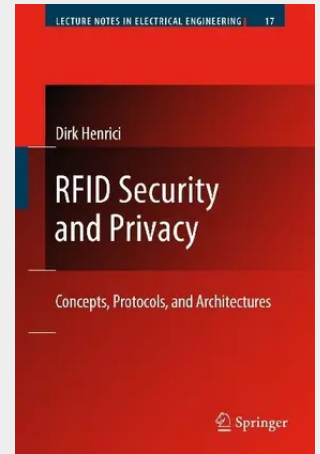


RFID Security and Privacy
