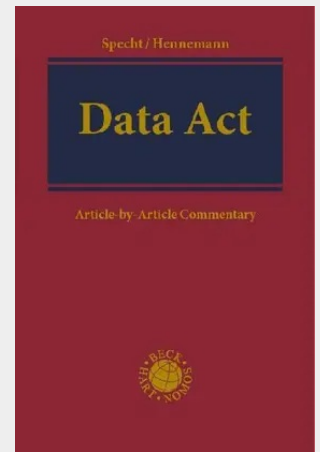


Data Act

The Data Act (DA) forms the central pillar of the new EU Data Law regime – framing data generation, access, use and transfer. The DA focuses in particular on data access for businesses, consumers and the public sector, on data contracts and on cloud switching.
